14:00 - 14:45	<p>Presentation:</p> <p style="text-align: center;">“IEA’s Role in Global Energy Security”</p> <p>Abstract:</p> <p>The International Energy Agency (IEA) was created in the midst of the 1973 oil supply crisis as policy makers in industrialised countries were alerted to the extent of their dependence on oil imports and to the inherent vulnerability of that dependence. The IEA was therefore created as a multifaceted organisation designed to help its member countries cope with short-term oil supply disruptions in a co-ordinated and unified manner.</p> <p>This presentation will discuss the IEA ever evolving role in global energy security. It will cover IEA mechanisms and policies with regards to oil supply crises, and will consider IEA member country obligations to the International Energy Programme (the IEA’s founding treaty) and the differing emergency response policies. It will describe the expansion of the IEA’s work on energy security beyond oil to include gas and electricity, and also cover IEA work with key consuming non-member countries. It will conclude by considering how energy security considerations are evolving and by showing how the IEA is adapting its work to better meet these emerging challenges.</p>
